# 1. A little history

---

- Reconciliation after World War II
  - Initiative of French and German mayors
  - Example was followed very fast by all western countries
- New boost after the fall of the Berlin Wall with countries in Eastern Europe
- Bringing people together / Make friendships across borders



## 2. European movement

- More than 30 000 twinning links in Europe
- A unique instrument to promote European citizenship and European integration
- European support since 1989
  - Now 'Europe for Citizens' programme
- Europe from bottom up
  - Official twinning agreement
  - Involvement of citizens
  - Long term perspective

- Analysis of the starting situation
  - Vision
  - Obstacles
  - What to offer
  - Budget
  - Responsibility for the execution of projects
- Identification of the target groups
  - Youth / Disabled / Elderly / schools / policy makers...



- Identification of objectives
- Methodology
  - City administration takes all responsibility
  - City administration does practical organisation and execution – content and ideas come from civil society organisations
  - Twinning committee has all responsibility – strong ties with city governance needed
- Communication -‘marketing’ strategy
  - Use of town newsletter – website – local radio

## 5. Future challenges

---

- Keeping the twinning alive and dynamic
- Involving young (new) people
- Putting new themes on the twinning agenda
  - Priority themes of the Europe for Citizens Programme
    - Permanent themes: Future of EU and its basic values, Participation and democracy in Europe, Inter-cultural dialogue, employment, social cohesion and sustainable development, Impact of EU policies in societies
    - Yearly themes: European year for combatting poverty and social exclusion (2010) European year of volunteering (2011) European year for Active Ageing and intergenerational Solidarity
- Beneficial to citizens and to the local authorities
- Multilateral twinings
